The next test then will be for the Executive Committee to hold its meeting via teleconference prior to the annual meeting in Philadelphia. At the board meeting we learned that the site for our 2021 spring meeting has not yet been established. Please notify Steve Krebs or one of the eastern directors if your chapter/district would be willing to host the spring 2021 annual meeting. There are many nice plants already started by District 12 for the plant sale, especially Brueckner and Vineland hybrids.

A long-standing policy that Gold and Silver Medals be given only at the Annual (Spring) Meeting was discussed, and it was decided that Silver Medals may now be given at a Fall Conference if that is the more logical venue. Since the Silver Medal is a regional award, some potential recipients may not regularly attend the Annual Meeting when it is geographically distant. The Honors Committee will select all Gold and Silver Medal recipients the same as always. Citations for both medal types will be sent to the calligrapher at the same time, and so the verbiage as to the date of presentation to silver medal awardees will thus need to be specified. The absent member will not be identified at the Annual meeting, but it will be announced that "another Silver Medal will be awarded later to a recipient not here today. Be sure to watch your JARS to find out about the presentation.

It was a good meeting and there was plenty of time for everyone to speak. I believe we all felt we accomplished our mission.

I hope you had a great Holiday Season and that at our next meeting in Philadelphia, we'll talk about our wonderful gardens with both our old and new friends!
